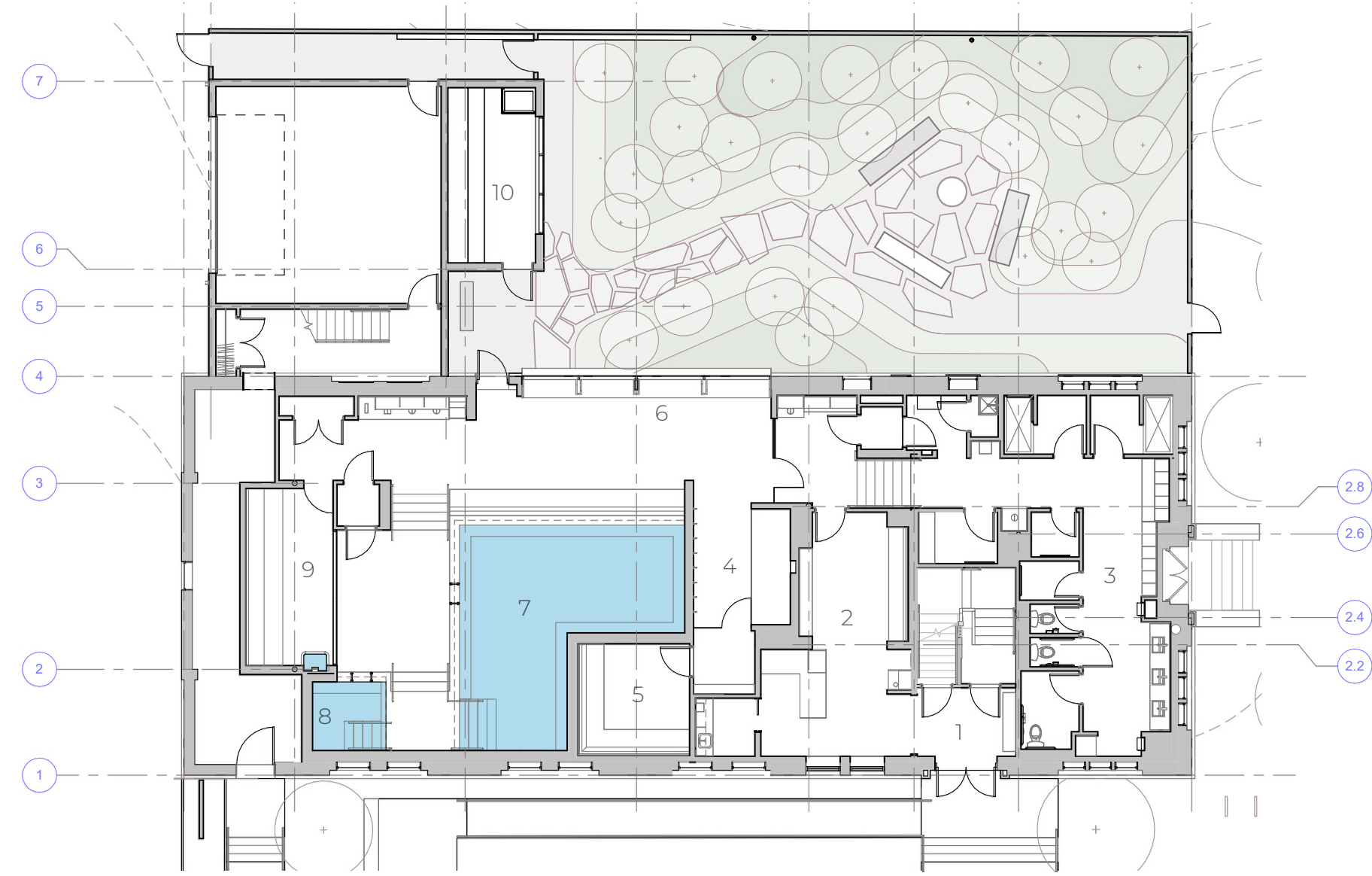

This project paired a ground-floor spa and wellness club with a private residential loft above for the owners.

I developed the project from its earliest stages, working closely with the clients to establish both the spatial organization and overarching concept.

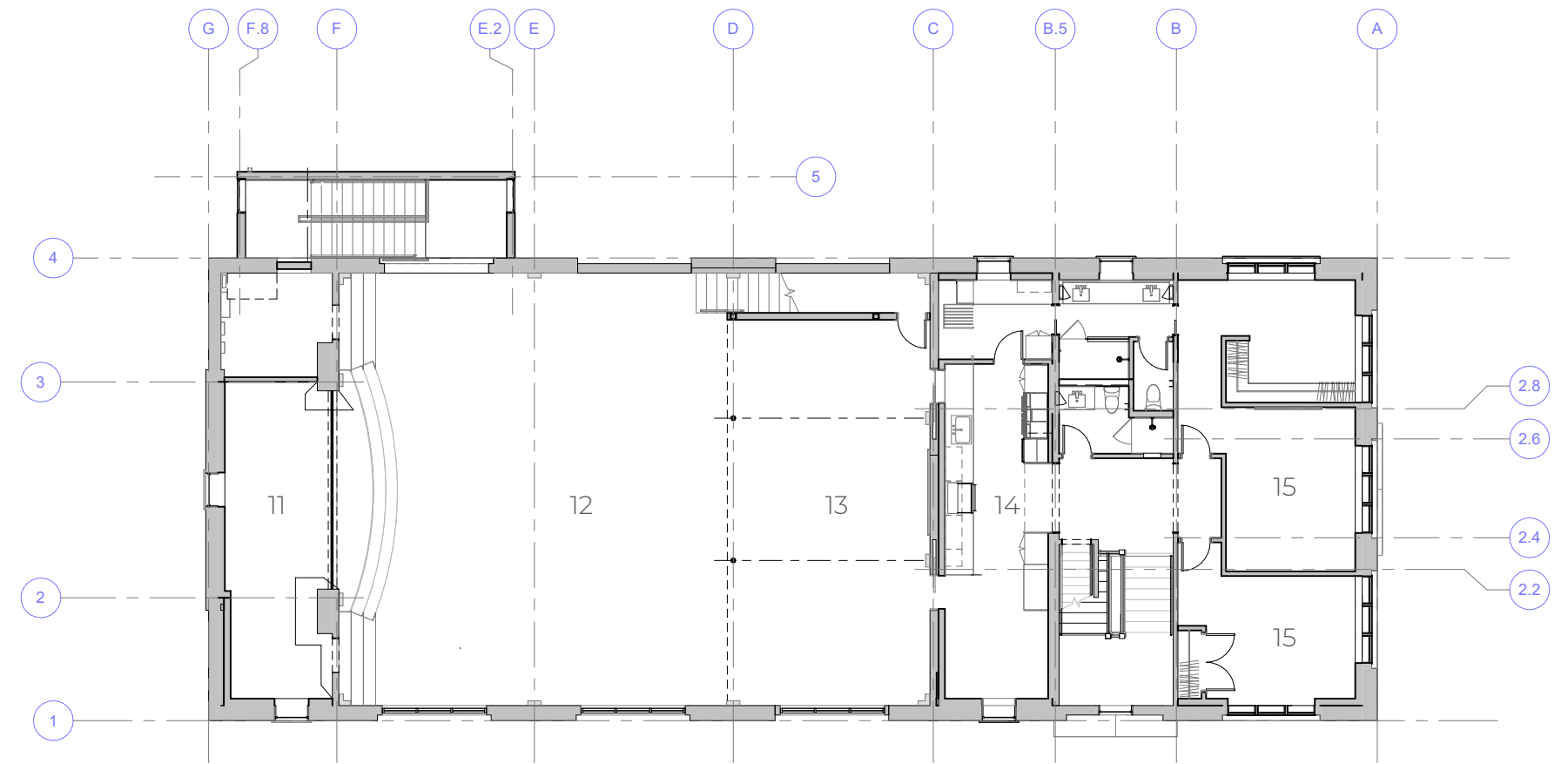
The spa program comprises a mineral and cold plunge pool, steam room, rock salt cave, outdoor sauna, courtyard, and lobby café. It is structured through a tiered deck system, where above-ground pools cascade in elevation.

Each programmatic element is given its own distinct zone, encouraging a gradual discovery of space and a continuous sense of movement and exploration.

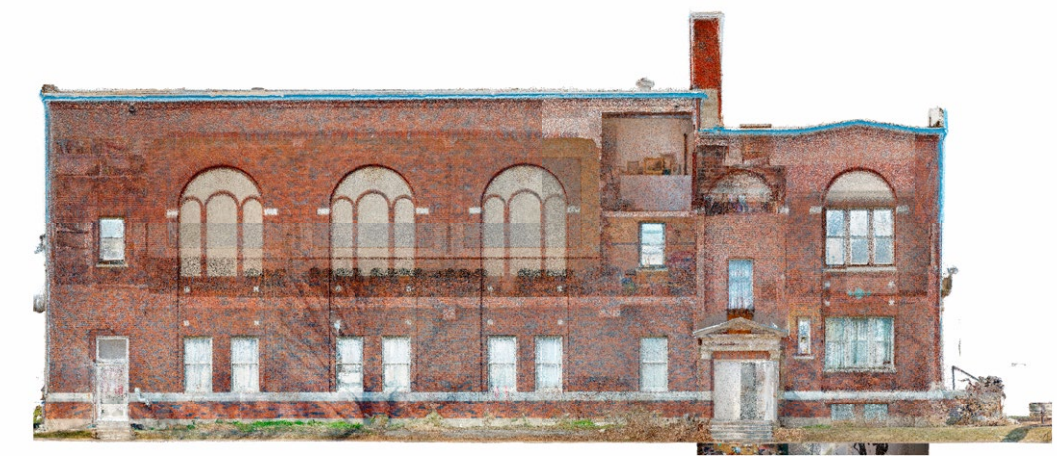
MAIN POOL

The project is housed within a historic Masonic lodge, presenting both constraints and opportunities for reinterpretation.

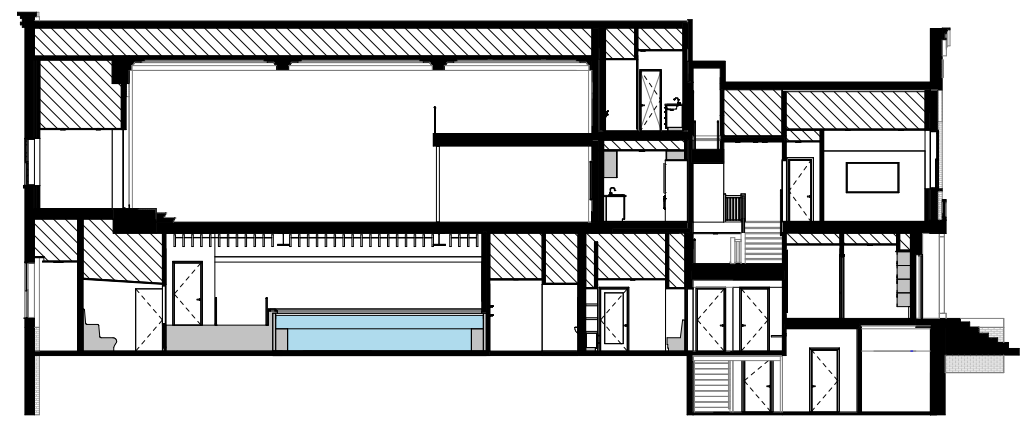
Rather than overwrite the existing structure, we leveraged its inherent spatial qualities most notably within the residential loft, where the former main hall is preserved as an open living volume.

Existing brick patterns informed the placement of new, large-scale window openings, allowing light in while maintaining a dialogue between past and present.

The result is a layered environment that balances contemporary living within a historically resonant framework.

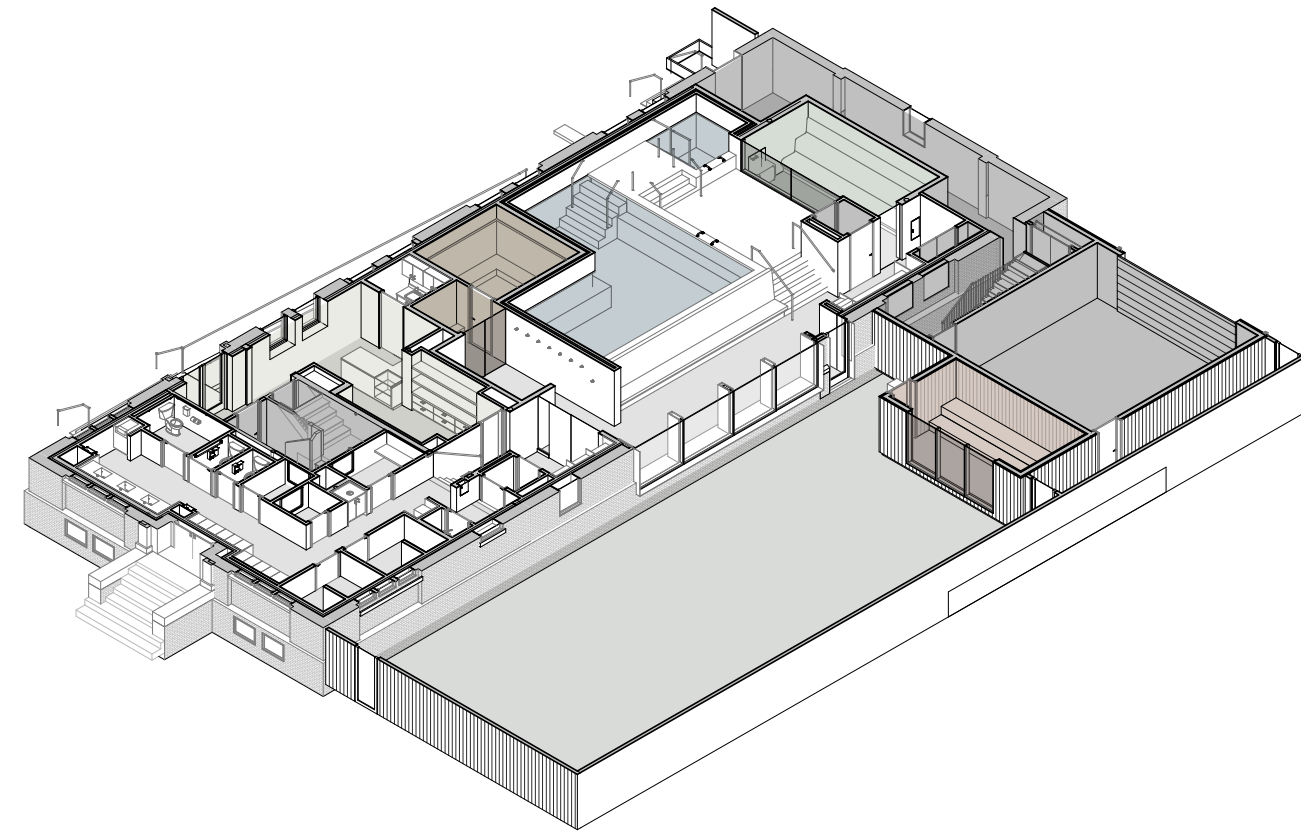

Each wellness zone has its own distinct look and feel. This deepens the experience by allowing patrons to explore and resonate with each room as they experience the benefits of what they offer.

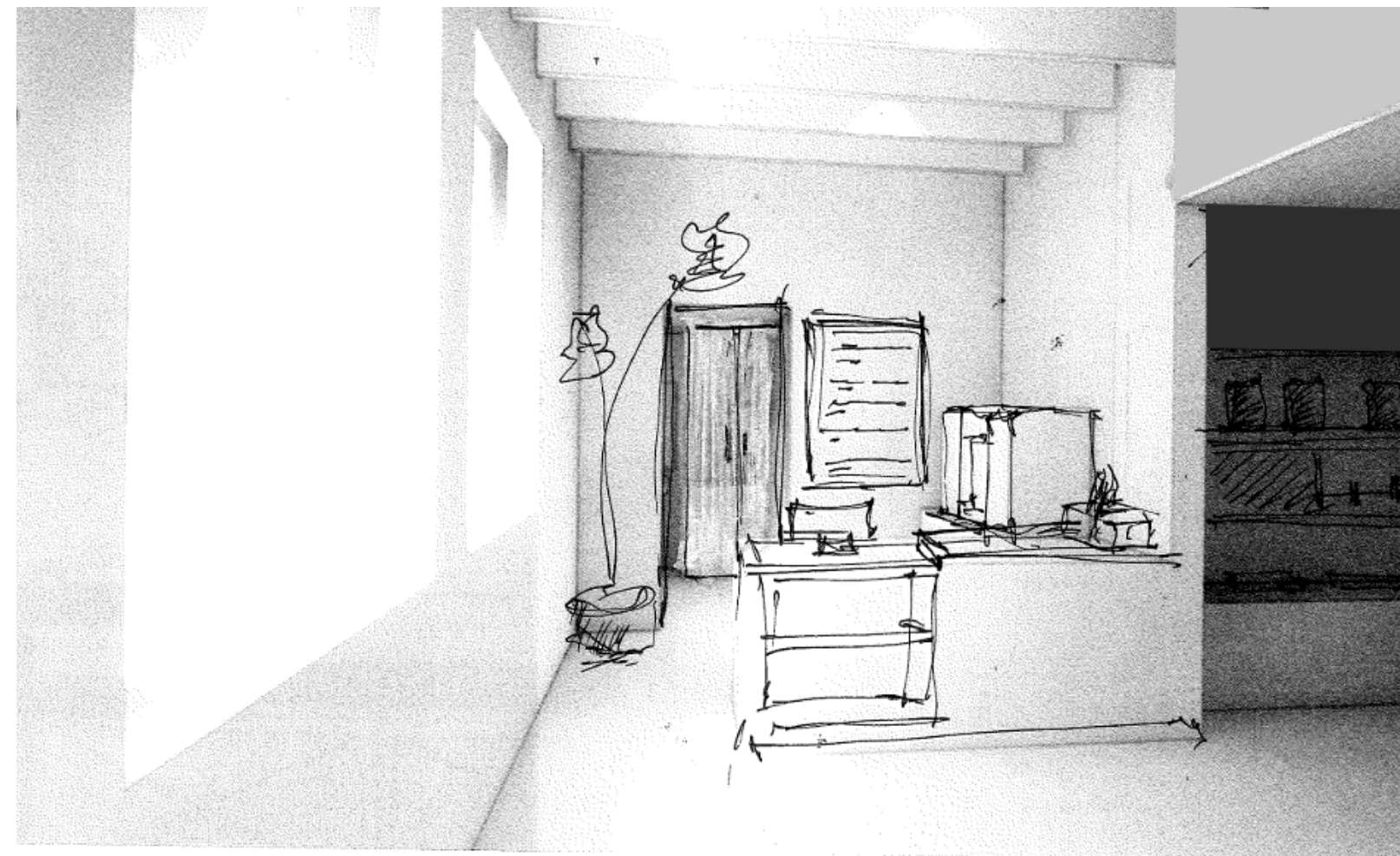
These came through many iterations and conversations around what helps us relax and feel at ease in these spaces. A main goal of the spa was to build a sense of community around these rituals and encourage interactions

This adaptive reuse project originated through a comprehensive 3D scan of the existing structure, using LiDAR technology to capture millions of spatial data points to create a scale model of the space.

I translated this point cloud data into a fully realized digital model in Revit, establishing an exact representation of the future space.

This methodology reflects a broader body of work, including over 30 survey drawings developed for retail projects nationwide, where point cloud modeling serves as the foundation for accurate documentation and design integration.

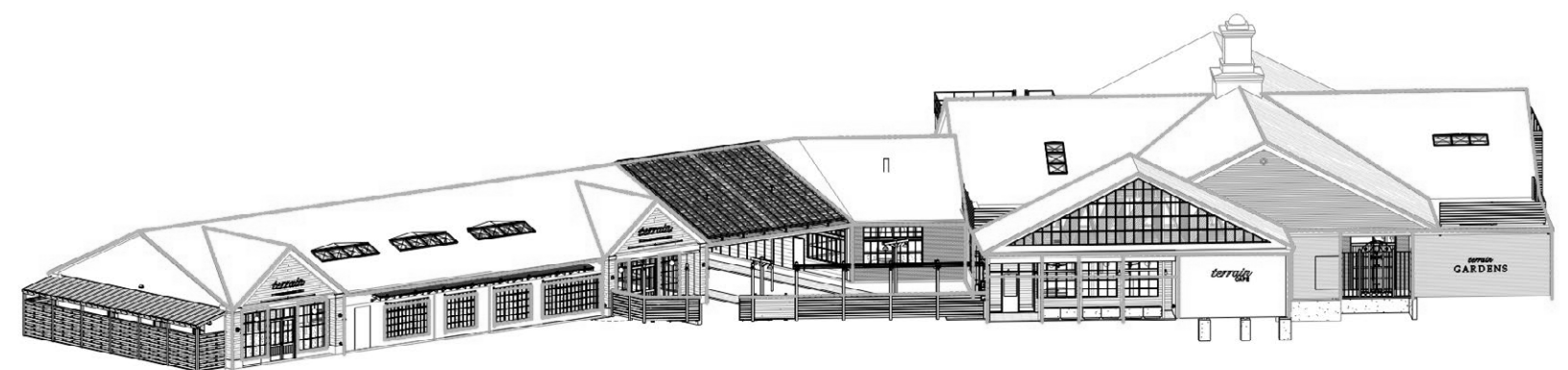
EVENTS FLOOR PLAN

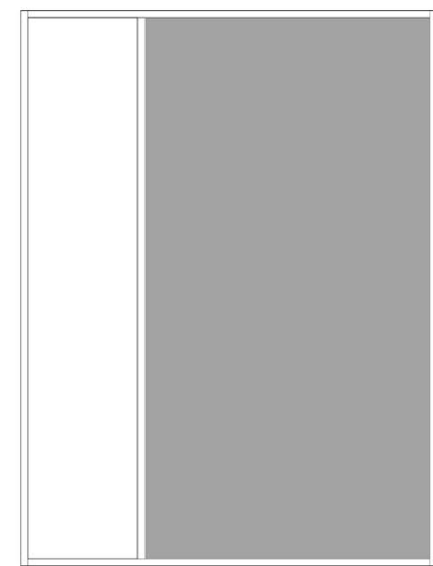
In December 2025 I designed and built an installation to display my furniture work for a holiday event at Grainline.

The concept behind the structure was to create a frame work for the objects to be experienced through. An opportunity to step in to the world that I have crafted

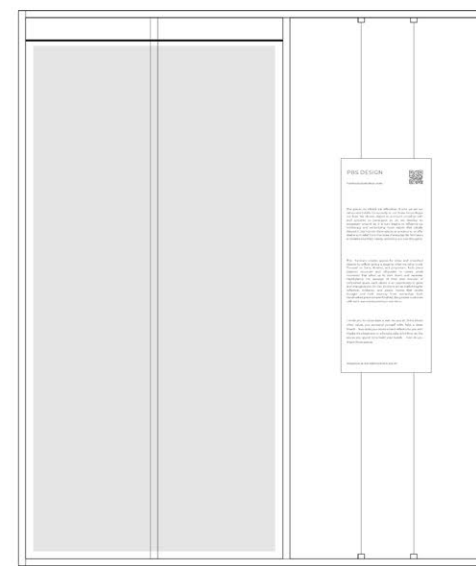

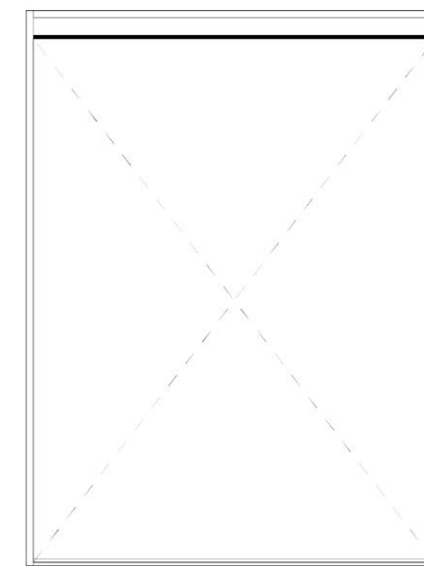

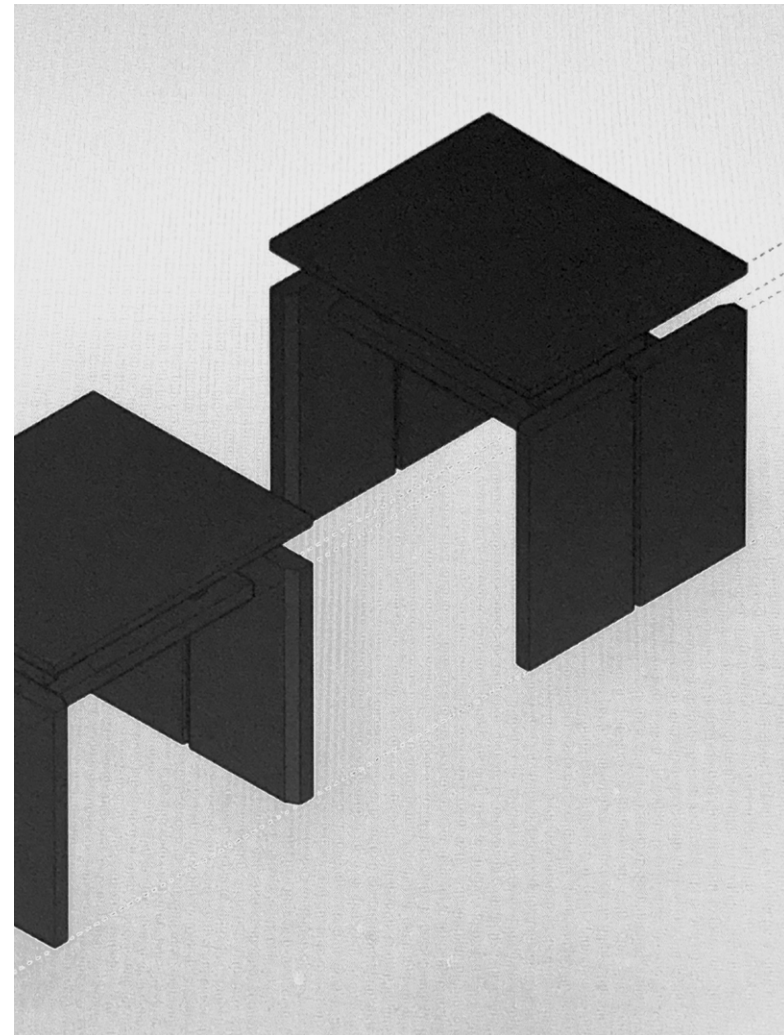

Inspiration

Refinement through experimentation. The goal was to facilitate rest and contemplation. Structure is intentionally open and disconnected, allowing thoughts to flow freely. Side panels stand monolithic and firm, creating a protective boundary from the noise of daily life.



Conceptualization

A seat is an offer to rest, a moment to recollect. Rest is the deliberate act of slowing down, stepping out of motion so the mind and body can settle. Recovery is what happens within that pause. It is the gradual rebuilding that follows stillness, where energy returns, perspective realigns, and the self grows stronger through reflection.



Fabrication

Building prototypes helped to push the object to be suited to the human experience. Fabricating and working hands on to solve details and relationships that can not be felt through computer modeling. Made sustainably and locally sourced ash wood, reclaimed from fallen trees throughout Hennepin County. The wood carries memories of place and time, reminding us that renewal is right under our seat.



Realization

Reflection occurs when the environment allows one to project inner thoughts and feelings onto the space, letting the surroundings become a mirror for the mind. In this stillness, we begin to recognize our patterns, values, and the quiet structures that guide how we move through the world. To understand your perspective is to engage with space and life intentionally, allowing reflection to guide the way.

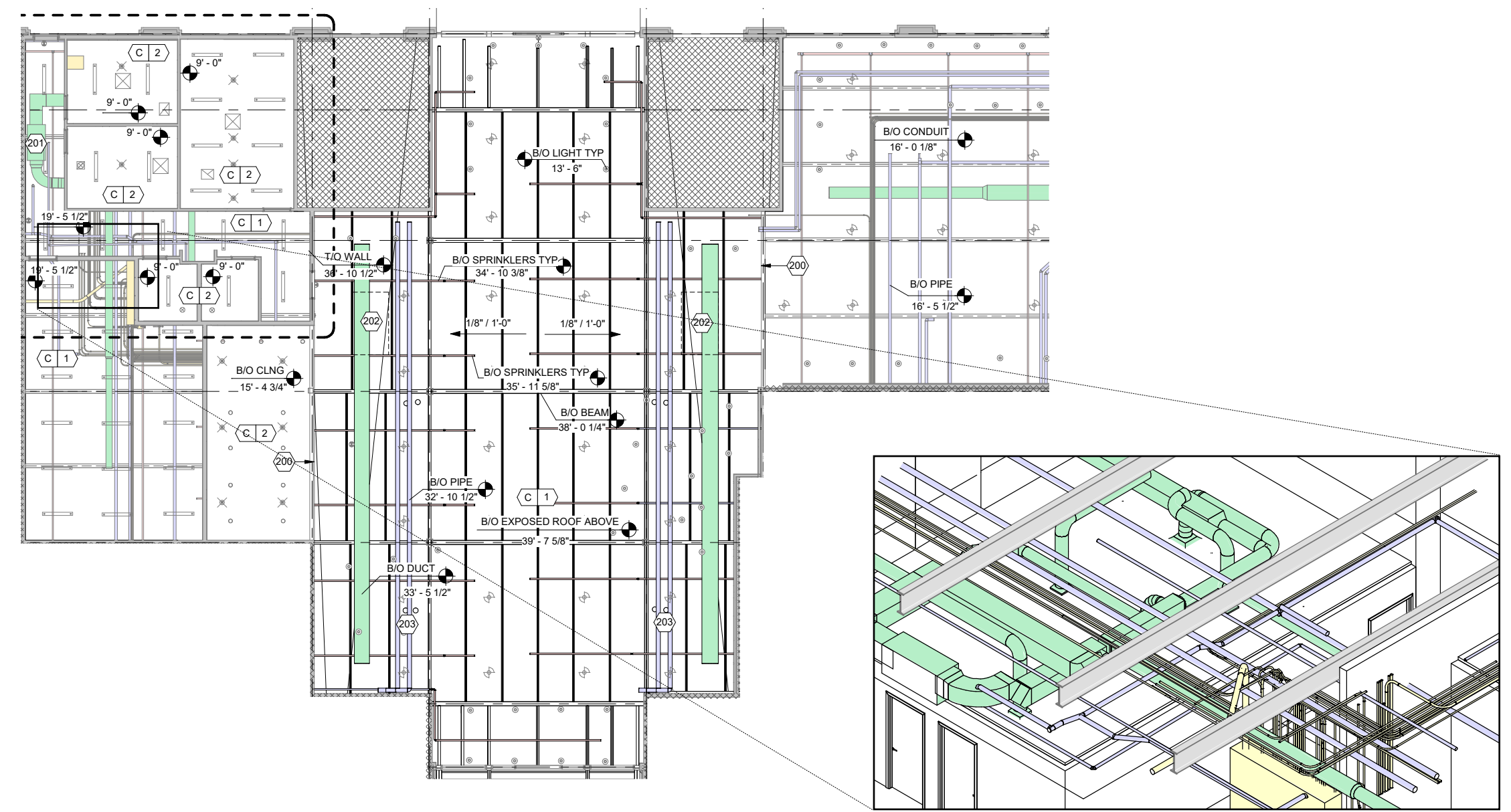

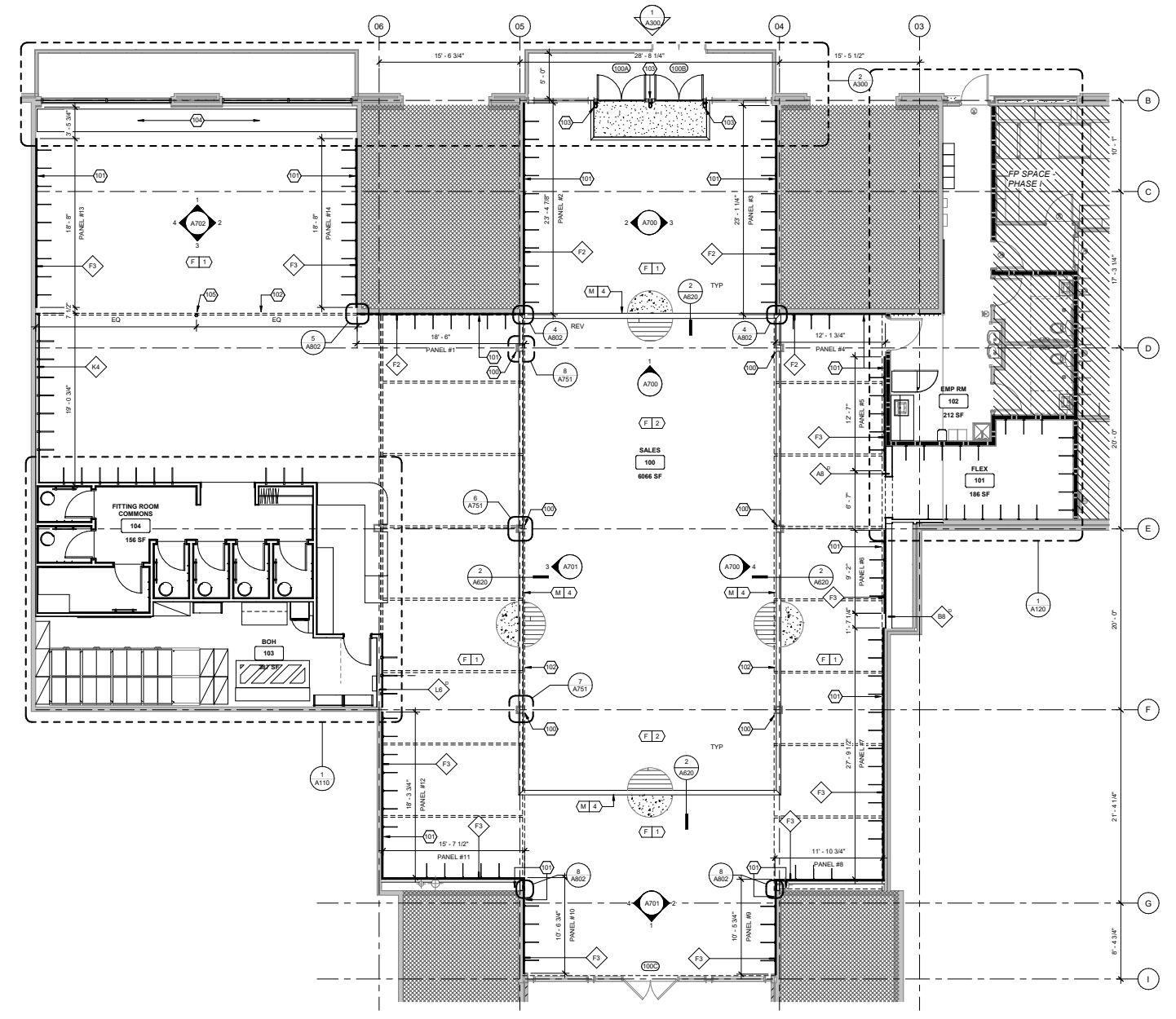

These visual studies illustrate the porous relationship between the building and its surrounding community, with activity extending from the dining space into the street.

This condition reflects Kim's engagement with the urban fabric and her commitment to fostering an inclusive, socially connected environment.

The primary structural gesture introduces a secondary ceiling grid, suspended from the existing beam system and rotated to establish a new spatial order.

This reorients the dining environment along an alternate axis, subtly recalibrating perception, movement, and occupation within the space.

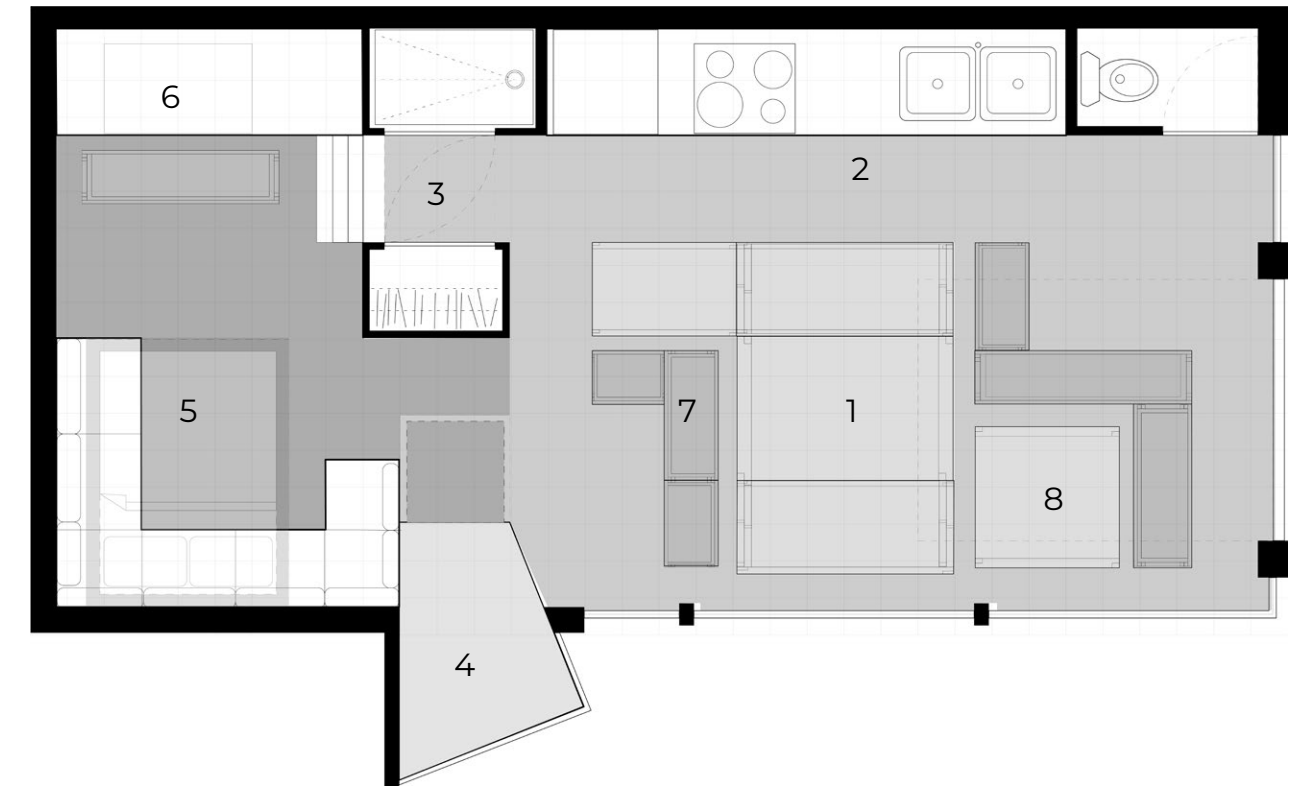
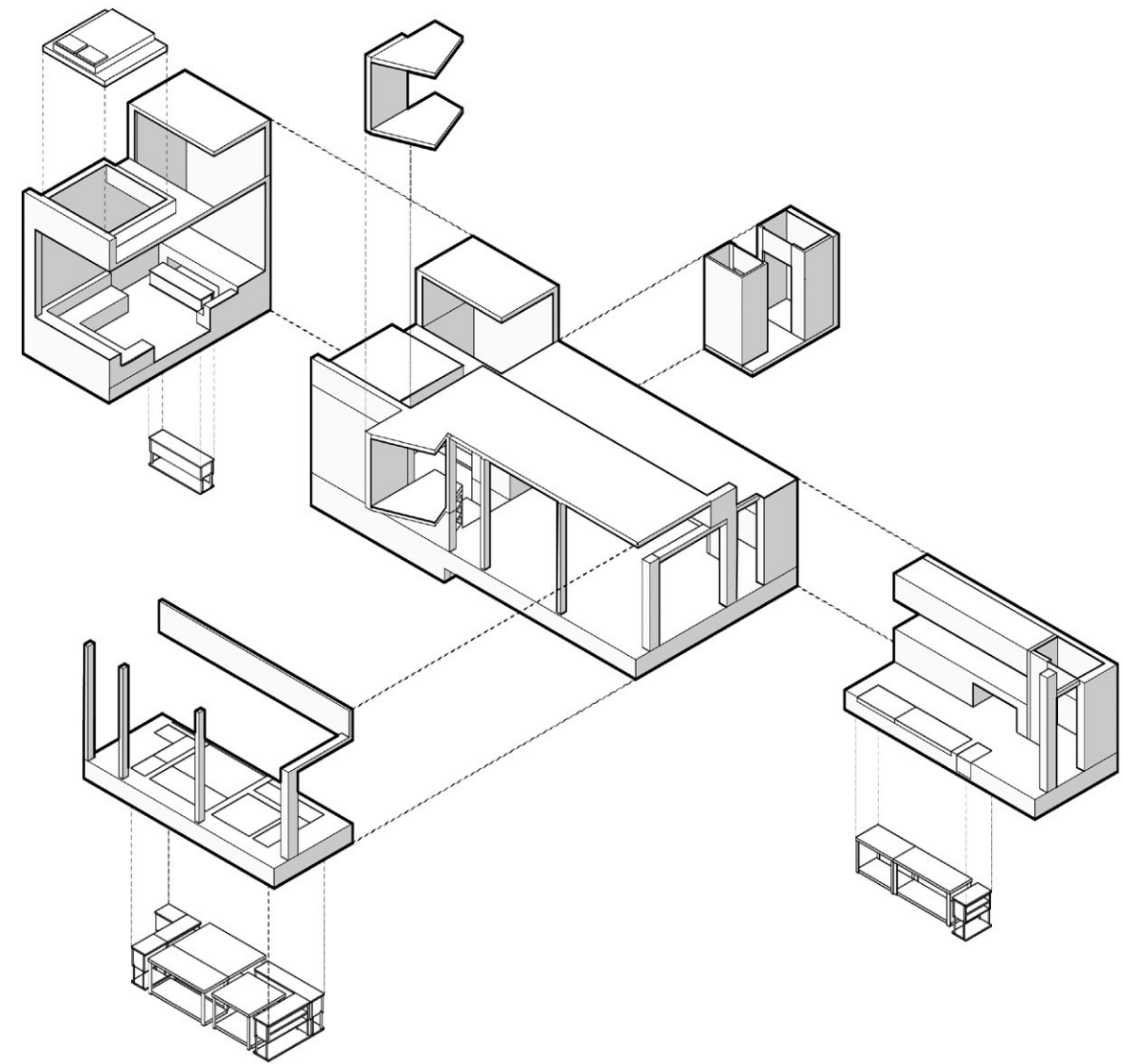

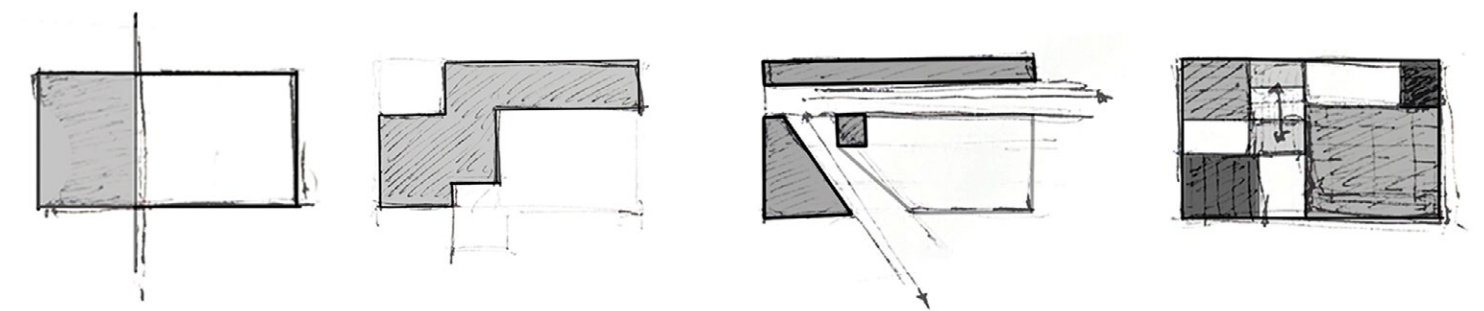
This studio led by Salvador Blumenkron, who afterwards brought me on at Collage Architects, explored the design of a tiny home.

My solution paired integrated furniture and a modular unit, allowing for flexibility in configuration and use.

The result is a distilled approach to living yet expansive in its capacity for smooth and flexible transformation.

Through iterative study, themes emerge, guiding me to a solution that is optimal for conserving space

Consolidating the kitchen and bathroom into a single service wall, freeing the remainder of the plan for open, inhabitable space.

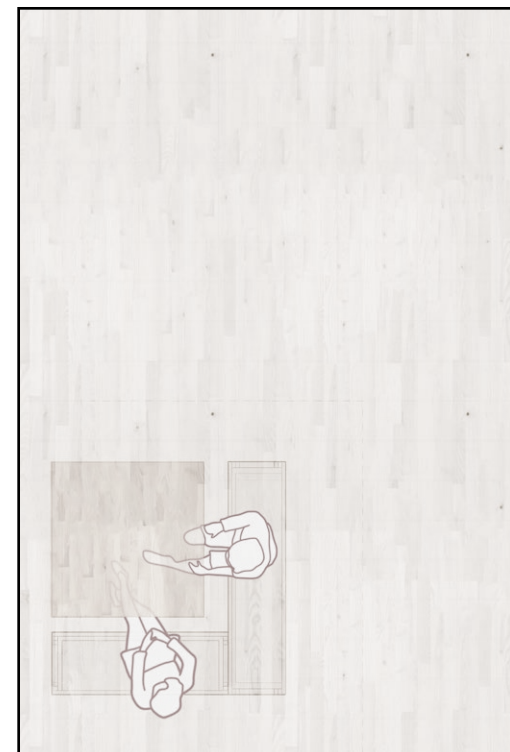

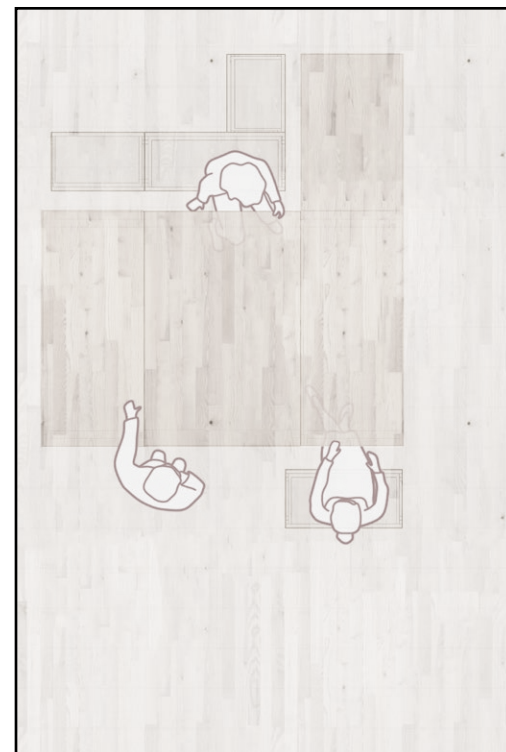

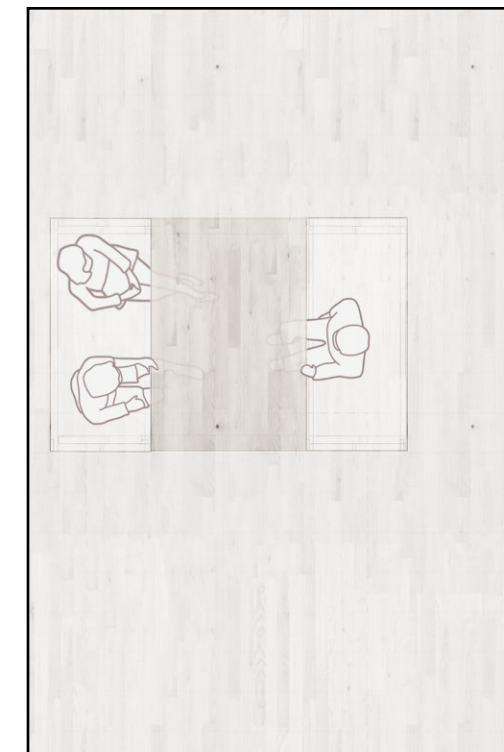

Storage is embedded within the floor plane, where concealed elements double as seating and work surfaces, minimizing the need for conventional furniture.

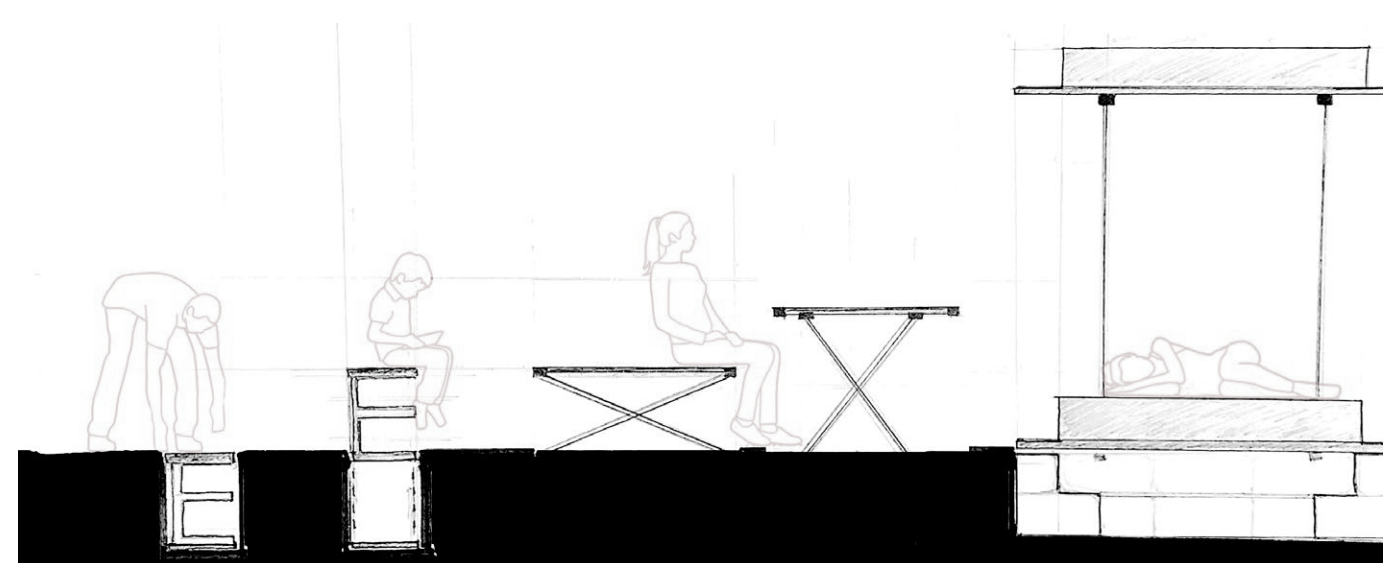
Utilizing the integrated furniture, you can accommodate a range of daily activities. The space operates as a dynamic system

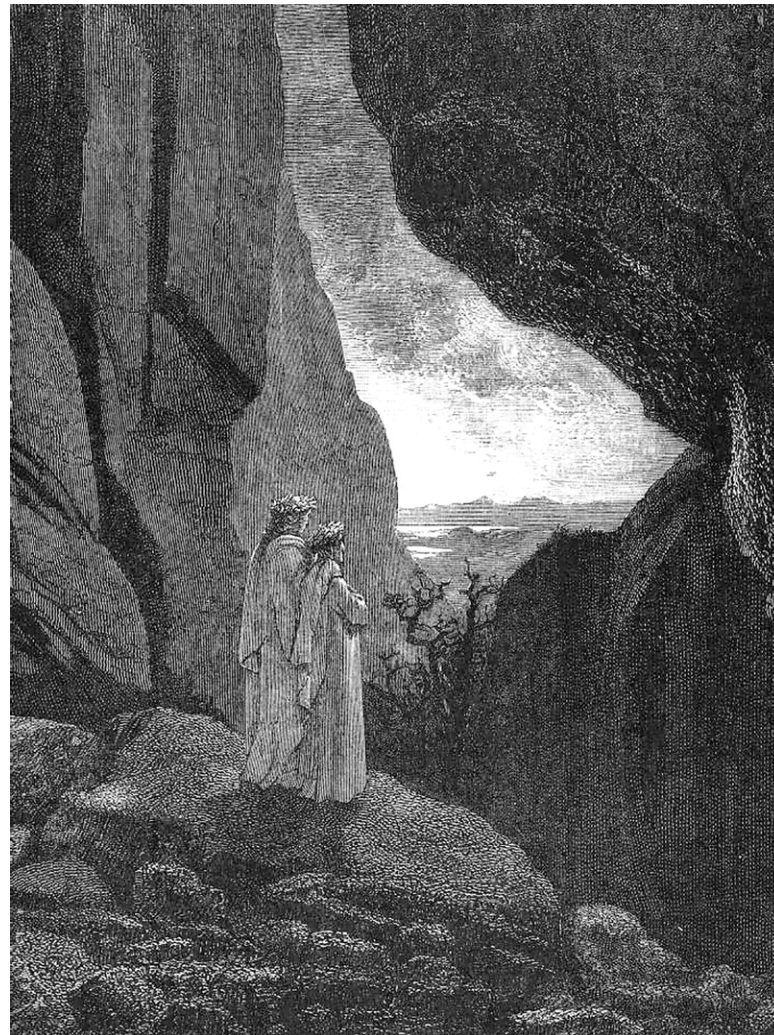

Inspiration

Gustave Doré's wood engraving depicting Canto XXXIV of Dantes Inferno. Depicting Dante, after descending to the lowest ring of Hell, inverts direction and begins climbing upward, emerging from the depths of Hell toward the mountain of Purgatory. Doré's work illustrates this moment of transition, the moment of contemplation and reflection when he is done with the tribulation yet one last passage lies in front of him. A clear threshold of then and now



Conceptualization

Defined by the absence of space. The light creates a tension between forms both filling and vacating the space, defining the void as a space of its own. Limen is a sensory threshold, the moment when something subtle becomes perceptible. This transitional zone heightens awareness as one moves from one condition to another.



Fabrication

Light highlights this transition as its presence can be perceived and reflected by the opposing faces, each side playing a role in defining the structure. Each light features two knobs controlling both light color and temperature. These lights are all fabricated and wired by myself



Realization

The Limen Light embodies this point of contemplation providing both presence and perspective, the two elements required for reflection. The absence of structure frames a future, a destination, and possibilities beyond its form. Deletion in this case is not a disappearance, but a threshold. An absence making space for what comes next
